

Global commitment to Peace has never been higher





SDG 16 Global REPORT RESULTS

The report covers 44 of the 56 SDG16+ indicators and finds that:

- 9/44 indicators have data for only one year.
- Only $\frac{11}{4}$ ndicators have data for more than 90% of countries.
- Indicators like arms trafficking, sexual violence and underreporting of violence are comparable for less than 40% of countries.














CAPACITY CHALLENGES


